

# Picture for North Carolina Getting Brighter!

We are continuing to monitor the impacts of COVID-19 and are pleased to share some positive news, as North Carolina is progressing faster than originally expected. A couple of weeks ago, the estimated date for peak resource use was April 28, however, it is now April 15 (13 days sooner). Also, the peak count of daily deaths has dropped significantly to under 25, and is expected to occur mid-April as well. See graphs below. For additional information, please visit:

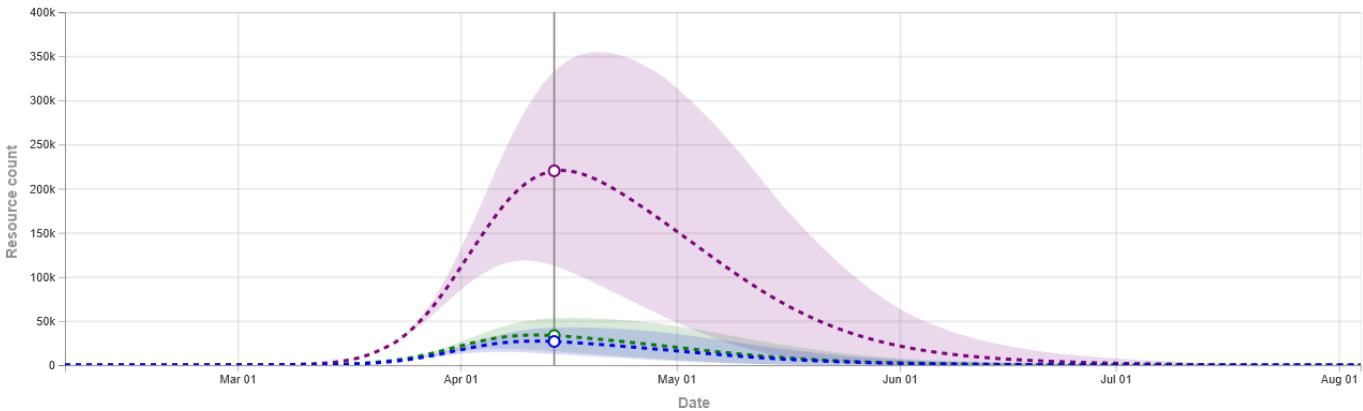

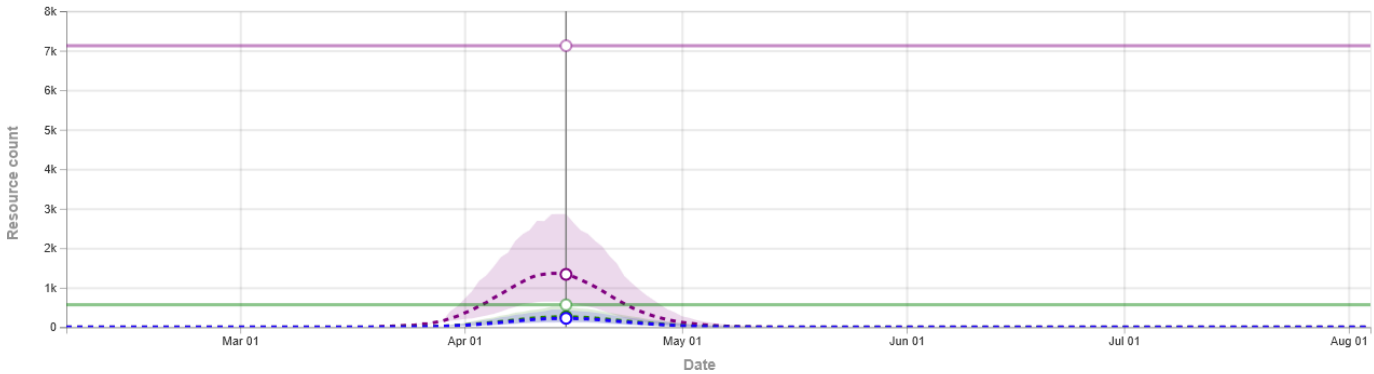

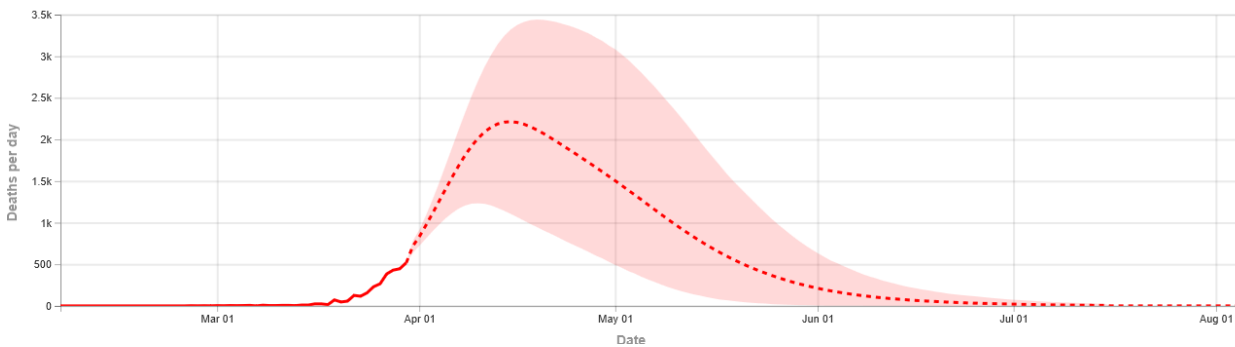
